Instant Bible Study on Any Verse

Perimeter the verse: read what comes before and atier the verse on which you are meditating.

Paraphrase the verse: summarize and put it into your own words.

Pulverize the verse:

- 1. Emphasize each word by exclamation.
- 2. Pick two or three words that represent God's message.
- 3. Ask about the words who? what? when? where? why? how?

Personalize the verse: Put yourself and God directly into the verse on which you are meditating.

Pray the verse back to God: sighting adoration, confession, thanksgiving and supplication.

Parallel the verse: locate any verses that are on the same theme as the one on which you are meditating.

Problems in the verse: of doctrine, reproof, correction and training in righteousness which need to be addressed.

Possibilities of helping others through the verse: through prayer, word or deed.

Reading the New Testament in 2021

What is F-260 All About?

The Bible tells us many spiritual truths that we need to know about:

- 1. WE MUST ABIDE IN CHRIST: "I am the vine, you are the branches; the one who remains in Me, and I in him bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing." John 15:5
- 2. THE HOLY SPIRIT IS OUR TEACHER:
 "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit whom
 the Father will send in My name, He
 will teach you all things, and remind
 you of all that I said to you." John
 14:26
- 3. WE LIVE LIFE IN COMMUNITY: "and let's consider how to encourage one another in love and good deeds, not abandoning our own meeting together, as is the habit of some people, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near." Hebrews 10:24-25

How F-260 Works:

- 1. Read ONE chapter of the New Testament each day, Monday-Friday.
- 2. Apply the HEAR Journaling Strategy: to Highlight, Explain, Apply, and Respond to the text for each day. Our goal is NOT to read the New Testament through in a year, but to HEAR

- from God, a litile each day.
- 3. Atiend ONE Small Group each week, to discuss what the Holy Spirit taught you in your reading that week. What specific personal illumination or application does God have for you in his Word?
- 4. Weekends—Saturday is to catch up on reading, Sunday is to worship together.

Using the HEAR Strategy:

- H = Read the chapter and discover just ONE verse that jumps off the page, HIGH-LIGHT that verse and meditate on it.
- 2. E = Now seek to EXPLAIN what that verse means. What is the context? What comes before and atier the word, phrase, passage, or chapter? How does this relate to the rest of the book or the Bible? Is this literal or figurative language? Is the text prescriptive (to DO something) or descriptive (information)? What does the verse teach about Jesus, theology, myself, others, or God's mission?
- 3. A = APPLY the text to your life. What does passage teach about God? What does it mean today? How can I apply it's teaching? Is there an action or ati tude that I must avoid or embrace? What is God saying to me?
- 4. R = How is God moving me to RESPOND to what I read today? Is there a call to action?

Is there something God wants me to do or pray about? How does my life need to change or transform?
